



After high school, Bro. Larry continued with what he thought was his true calling—work in the restaurant industry. He promoted from restaurant manager to district manager at Coco's. Then, in 1985, he did what most Armenians do—he opened his own business. He opened Sherm's

Place, a sandwich shop, in Anaheim. Three years later, he opened Sherm's South Street Café also in Anaheim.

Bro. Larry in the 1990's found his true calling when he switched to the same business his father had once owned—truck sales. He first worked at Tom's Truck Center in Santa Ana and later Carmenita Ford. He ended his career at Enterprise Motors.

When Bro. Larry turned 40; a man that had hardly dated in 40 years soon became one of the Armenian community's most eligible bachelors. At the OC Trex picnic in 2003, Bro. Larry joked that he had three girlfriends attending the picnic that year. Only one girl he wanted all of his Brothers to meet. His wife to be he started dating in 2003 and were married by 2007. Bro. Larry and wife Rita moved to Glendale after being married.

Bro. Larry visited Armenia in 2016 and was moved by a visit to the Isahakian village school. A tour of the school revealed a gymnasium in need of repair. With money raised, the renovated gymnasium will be dedicated in Bro. Larry Sherman name by the Armenian Educational Foundation.
