Earthquake in Armenia

The devastating earthquake hit Armenia on a peaceful morning December 7, without a warning whatsoever. School children, men, women, young and old were caught off guard. The main tremor was recorded at 6.9 on the Richter scale. The whole world was shocked to hear reports of "tens of thousands" of deaths and millions of dollars' worth of destruction. Official estimates were as high as 100,000 deaths.

The suffering and grief because of the tragedy was beyond comprehension. The international outpouring of relief assistance and aid was unprecedented. Governments from around the world were sending supplies and technical help to the needy.

Armenian communities all over the world have united to send financial and technical help to their countrymen in Armenia. It is gratifying to see that individual Triple X Chapters have contributed in their way to the relief of the disaster. The Grand Chapter had solicited funds to be channelled through Medical Outreach Program.

Our history which is centuries old has survived many tragedies and catastrophies. We have survived the massacre which was planned and perpetrated by another government in the early years of the twentieth century.

We are hopeful Armenians will rise from the ashes once again to a new and stronger nation near our ancestral Mt. Ararat.






